Due to the overwhelming success of Girl's Night Out 2006, Dr. Wright has joined with CITY House to create a way to help the children of Collin County. CITY House is a community organization which provides a nurturing and safe environment for children who need emergency care for up to 90 days. CITY House helps children with their personal self-esteem by offering art and play therapy, and providing free family counseling. These children, who could be your neighbor's children, require clothes, food, shelter and counseling. CITY House offers help to children of all ages, and at the moment there is a shortage of clothing for children ages 5-10. Girl's Night Out 2007 is trying to help with this problem.

Dr. Wright has again accumulated the same fabulous door prizes, including a 4-Day Getaway to Cabos San Lucas, Mexico, and every person will receive a complimentary raffle ticket upon registering. But to increase your odds of winning, each woman will receive an additional raffle ticket for every piece of new or "gently-used" clothing that is donated for children ages 5-10. "Many children in our area have clothes that they have outgrown. If each woman brings just one piece of clothing, we will have over 200 items!" states Candice Ort, patient of Dr. Wright and former president of CITY House.
